## FOUNDER OF SHANTHI EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY (R.)



### Our Founder Late Shri K.N. Nagegowda

Mr. Nagegowda K.N. who founded this institution and guided it to reach such an unattainable heights was born on February 1st 1944. Second son of Kempegowda and Choudamma, Nagegowda got his primary and high school education in Malavalli itself. He joined to Vijaya Pre-University College in 1963 and later completed his Engineering graduation at PES College, Mandya. He was an able leader since his student life. He became the president of Mandya district Congress committee in 1974, two times Member of Legislative Council, and served as Minister of Animal Husbandry and as Major Irrigation Minister in Karnataka Government. Under his tenure he proved himself as a true leader.

He possessed an analytical mind, and an infinite capacity for work, a knack for human relations. He was a real academician, politician and a man of generosity. His quick and dashing decisions proved his real leadership qualities and became a role model to many people. A great practitioner who believes in practicing what he preaches. His dreams are brought to reality. 'Vision, Perseverance and Determination to succeed' was the motto of his life. A self-confessed workaholic he has always been a man with a vision. He believes that all rural students are equally capable and is of the opinion that they should channelise their efforts in the right direction.

In his adolescent age itself he felt that there was an urgent need to start a College in Malavalli Taluk to cater the rural aspirant students. His vision was fulfilled as soon as he established Shanthi College in 1970. Under his able guidance Shanthi college has grown in leaps and bounds.

Due to his sad demise on February 5th 2004, the college lost its main pillar. However, Smt. Nagamani Nagegowda wife of Mr. K.N. Nagegowda Ex. MLA shoulders the responsibility to accomplish her husband's dream. She along with two secretaries of the college viz. Mr. M.H. Kempaiah and Mr. H. Thimmegowda and Treasurer Mr. Putteerogowda along with other governing council members and staff members of the college have been striving hard to provide quality education to the rural youth. Their untiring efforts paved the way to reach the mission of the college i.e. "Providing Higher Education to Rural Youth"

## GENESIS OF SHANTHI EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY AND COLLEGE

During 1970's Malavalli Taluk was one of the Socially, Economically and Educationally backward areas in Karnataka State. Students' could not continue their studies after matriculation due to dearth of higher education institutions in the Taluk. To continue their studies after secondary education they need to go to far-off places like Mysore and Bangalore. Only a few students' who were economically well-off continued their studies either in Mysore or Bangalore city. Consequently, number of talented students' dream of higher education became vanished. Invariably, they were forced to drop their education and involve with their parents in the agricultural activities.

To overcome these setbacks and to educate the inhabitants of this area it was imperative to start a College to nurture the talented rural poor students. Hence a group of young leaders of the town headed by Late, Sri K.N.Nagegowda took a brave initiative to bring up a degree College in Malavalli during 1970s.

After passing a number of hurdles and struggle they had succeeded in starting an institution to cater the needs of poor rural children. Hence the Shanthi Education Society (R) was established in the year 1970 with the noble mission of 'Providing Higher Education to the Rural Children'.

At the beginning the Shanthi Education Society (R) started a Pre- University College with Arts and Science combinations in a rented building. Later, during 1971 a Degree College was started in Arts combination at the Government high school building. The congested place was not conducive to give proper education to the students. So the management took a decision to have its own premises for the College. The management and the staff members started to beg and borrow funds from the number of supporting hands to accomplish the task. Due to their sincere efforts they had purchased around 6 acres of land in Mysore-Malavalli road to construct its own building for the College. Initially, with the help of a number of donors and with the support of 'Mysugar' factory the management had succeeded to construct an asbestos sheet building with 12 rooms. Gradually, with the help of UGC under different plan periods, and

with the support of the donors the management has constructed a beautiful semi-circle shaped building with sprawling green lawn. It adds beauty to the campus and provides good ambiance to teaching-learning process.

Responding to the socio-economic needs, the College has been able to project its versatile character by diversifying its curriculum from a purely Arts to a Commerce faculty. To keep pace with the globalization and to cater the needs of business world, the College opened commerce courses in general and vocational aspects in 1982. As the demand increased for commerce graduates in various fields, more and more admissions were given. After the induction of commerce faculty the College has been renamed as Shanthi Arts, Science and Commerce College.

Realizing the needs of the students the College started B.Sc. course in the academic year 1988-89, BBM course in 2000-01 and M.Com a post-graduation department in 2012-13. The College has permanent affiliation from the University of Mysore. Its Arts department was admitted to Grant-in-aid by the Government of Karnataka since its inception and the commerce department since July 1987. Other departments' viz. B.Sc., B.B.M, M.Com and all other courses are still under self-finance scheme. The College is recognized by the UGC under section 12B on 10-11-1980 and 2(f) on 28-02-1985.

The management has provided modern facilities like computers, audio-visual systems, internet facilities etc. Since the College has given maximum security to the girl students the strength of them keeps increasing every year and at present it is in 56%. They are given separate rest room and their problems are solved without delay.

The College had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the College on 9th and 10th of September 2004 and made meticulous supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the College. After the detailed evaluation the NAAC Peer Committee awarded “B+” Grade to the institution. Again in the year 2010 the college applied for re-accreditation and the peer team visited on 22nd and 23rd October, 2010 and awarded “B” Grade under new evaluation system. This is another milestone in the history of this rural College with limited resources.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO SHANTHI DEGREE COLLEGE

· Candidates who have passed the II PUC of Pre-University Board of Karnataka and other state boards and class 12th of the Central Board of Secondary Education or a recognised equivalent examination are eligible to apply. For all applicants, the aggregate marks required for admission will be calculated on the basis of marks secured in language and other subjects. Reservation policies of the Karnataka State are strictly followed for aided courses. Students who have excelled in Sports, Cultural, Physical and other events will be given priority in admission and physically challenged students will get seat at concessional fee.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

The College expects each student has the right to learn in a comfortable environment and in the meanwhile it expects each student has to adhere the rules and regulations of the College.

8. The College authorities reserve the right to revise any class schedule or to re-arrange the classes.
9. The College will not be responsible for any loss/damage of students' belongings.

12. Students can get benefits like Concessions, Scholarships in case of fulfilling the requirements.

THIS IS AN OFFENCE THAT IS PUNISHABLE UNDER ORDINANCE XV (B) & (C) OF THE UNIVERSITY IN THE WAKE OF THE RECENT SUPREME COURT RULING. - viii) Inciting others to do any of the acts aforesaid.
- ix) Making 'noise' in the corridors and the library which are designated silence zones.

xi) Smoking, use of drugs, alcohol or peddling drugs in the campus is prohibited.

The Discipline Regulation Committee is empowered to deal with cases of indiscipline.

The Principal of the College has the ultimate authority to take action against any breach of discipline. The principal has every authority to suspend the indisciplined student.

### **INTERNAL ASSESSMENT MARKS AND ELIGIBILITY FOR PASSING**

The internal assessment marks in a theory subject shall be based on average of the tests and assignments conducted during each semester on the dates prescribed by the college. For a pass in a subject, a candidate should secure a minimum of 40% of the marks prescribed for a subject in the university examination including internal marks. Each student has to undergo internal assessment for 20 marks and University examination for 80 marks.

### **ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT**

A candidate should undergo the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated to University of Mysore for the purpose. Each semester is considered as a unit, and a student shall put in a minimum of 75% of attendance in each of the subjects.

### **DRESS CODE**

The College authority is required to have appropriate dress code and will decide with the consent of the students. Students are required to wear uniforms as per schedule.

### **THE COLLEGE LIBRARY**

The college is equipped with a computerized library, functioning on the basis of an 'open access' system. It houses over 25000 book titles and subscribes to 20 journals/periodicals and Newspapers. Students are provided the facility of computers with high speed internet connectivity and access to e-journals through inflibnet. The library functions from 9.00 am to 5.30 pm on all working days. Students will keep their personal property at the counters provided outside the entrance to the library. Each student of the collegemay issue twobooks for a maximum period of fourteen days. A fine of one rupee per day will be charged upon the late return of a book up to 15 days and Rs.2/- per day thereafter.



The college takes a serious view of any form of indiscipline with respect to the library. Indiscipline includes creating noise and any form of disturbance inside the library and its immediate vicinity; disfiguring or damaging books, furniture or other library property; visiting prohibited internet sites; undue delay in return of books issued, etc. The Librarian will deal with any act of indiscipline with respect to the library and is empowered to debar any student indulging in such acts from further use of the library. Besides the college library, students are also offered the facility of Departmental Libraries, and may contact their respective departments about the same.

### SPORTS AND GAMES

A healthy mind in a healthy body makes for overall development of students. Students are encouraged to take up sports during their free time. Wide range of sports and games are available to students. Also financial support is provided to students who represent the college in competitive sports at state, national and international levels. The college has track records of maximum number of University players. Qualified and trained physical education teachers are available for students who need a helping hand.



### WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The WDC, in Shanthi College has actively provided counselling to students to make them aware of their own capabilities and potential while sensitizing them to various issues of society, especially gender issues. For this, a Counsellor has been appointed to help solve student problems. The centre empowers women by helping to develop their skills by building their confidence and honing their latent leadership qualities. This is done through a series of special guest lectures from noted personalities, group discussions etc.



## PLACEMENT AND COUNSELLING CELL

It provides information and guidance to help students find hands-on experience and employment opportunities. It also organizes workshops and training sessions on communication and employability skills in collaboration with departments and industries. The co-ordinators of the cell offers free counselling services and conducts sensitizing workshop and training programmes to create awareness, learn coping skills and develop positive mental health.

## ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic calendar of the college will be announced in the display board of the college.

## NSS
